Only two denominations are known of this rare and mysterious mint: the nummus and its third. Of the nummus there are only two known examples, the one in Paris (De Luynes) and the other in Naples (Collection Martinetti-Nervegna). Of the third nummus there are also known only a further two besides the one offered here likewise one in Paris (De Luynes) and the other in Naples (Martinetti-Nervegna). The two Naples specimens were acquired in the sale organized by the gallery Sangiorgi at Rome of the collection Martinetti-Nervegna on the 8th November 1907 and realized the astronomical figure of 26.000 lire in gold (today the equivalent of 7 kg gold). The identification of the mint was a subject of controversy between Minervini and the Duc de Luynes. The former believed it belonged to Aletium (here written as Baletium), the latter attributed it to Valetium di Mela identical to the Balesium of Pliny (III.16) today Villa Picciotti, the place where Martinetti-Nervegna's two coins were found, near where the river Pactius runs its course between Brundisium and Lupiae (Lecce).

This coin hitherto unknown is we think of the greatest importance. It is the link between the usual bull/Nike type as in Randazzo hoard (Arnold-Biucchi, Numismatic Studies 18) nos 48-76 and the final, very rare coin of this type (Rizzo pl. IX, 15) which is regarded as having been engraved by the master of the famous Aetna tetradrachm in Bruxelles (Rizzo pl. IX, 17; Kraay-Hirmer 33). Note particularly the new style of the running Nike, her tidy drapery and hair. In fact one might even think that being so different from the preceding coins, in style it is indeed a work of that great die-cutter. That our coin should be linked with the other Catania tetradrachm (Rizzo IX, 15) gains support from consideration of minting technique which are however a little complex. In the Randazzo hoard we see a long series of Catania tetradrachms of bull/Nike type will badly struck reverses, and the result of uneven and poorly centred striking. It is our suggestion that at a certain point (after the end of the Randazzo series) it was decided to revolutionize the method of striking. A return was made to a technique employed earlier for the incuse staters of Magna Graecia, that is the dies were mounted in a form of collar to ensure even and well-centres striking. The results can be seen in our coin as on the other two, the Catania and Aetna of Rizzo pl. IX, all struck by this same system, and all very closely contemporaneous. At the same time, furthermore, the traditional position of the iconography was inverted such that our coin has the Nike on the obverse, no doubt also an attempt to improve the quality of the striking. Between our tetradrachm and that of the Aetna master, which of course was also struck at Catania, there can only be two or three years difference at most.

## The Schøyen Collection

Schøyen started collecting in 1955. He has concentrated on ancient coins, besides the cast coinage of Italy and Roman medallions, he also has made a specialist collection of the emperor Vespasian, which is unrivalled by any other private collection worldwide. As an example, he holds twice as many tetradrachms struck in Syria for this emperor as all museums put together. His main interest, however, is now in medieval manuscripts where his collection is the largest in private hands in the world and in earlier written documents right back to the invention of writing ca 3.000 B.C..

Hence, Martin Schøyen is now offering for sale his entire collection of these large and monumental coins and we at NAC are proud to be organizing their dispersal.

### Introduction to the Bronze Cast Coinage

The cast coinage consists of four main groups representing various stages of its evolution. Aes Rude, or irregular lumps of mostly copper, are without any specific weight. There are three examples in the collection, lots 273, 274 and 275.

The second, Aes Formatum, or formed bronze, is not well known among numismatists or collectors today, even if Haeberlin wrote quite extensively about it (Aes Grave, Frankfurt 1910, p. 4-5). They were normally cast in round forms like cakes with sloping sides and subsequently broken in pieces. They were entirely unmarked. There are ten exempla lots 266-272, 275 (two pieces) and 276, the axe blade with most affinity to this group. Lot 266, the only known complete Aes Formatum of Haeberlin's type 2, was found in the old Etruscan port of Vulci in 1828, has a weight of 60 asses which according to the Roman law code in the 12 tablets from ca. 450 B.C. corresponds to 6 sheep or 0.6 ox. The fragments lots 267 and 270 have a weight of about 8 asses or about 0.8 sheep.

The third group, Aes Signatum, including the Ramo secco are the cast ingots with a design. The discussion amongst scholars about their intention and use seems to have no end. Ten examples of Aes Signatum are represented in the Schøyen Collection, lot 284, 306-313, 373 and the Ramo secco (with branch or fishbone pattern) lot 281. Lots 283 and 283 could be Aes Signatum as well as countermarked examples of Aes Formatum. The two complete specimens, lots 308 and 309, have a weight of about 5 asses or 0.5 sheep; half lumps down to small uncial fragments are all represented.

The remaining lots belong to the forth group, the familiar Aes Grave. The present collection of Italian and Roman bronze cast coinage is the most comprehensive group offered for sale in the 2nd half of the 20th century.

There is a graffito in roman cursive on the reverse of this coin that could be read as VITALIANI PPO, in the field l. between the emperor figure and the inscription. This Vitalianus may have been the owner of this medal, and consequently the whole Arras hoard, and would have held the office the Praetorian Prefect which is normally abbreviated PPO in inscriptions. No such praetorian prefect is known at this period, but our list of these is very incomplete; however the owner of this hoard, who had received accession, consular and quinquennial donatives present therein, should have been a person of such high rank, and hence such an interpretation of the graffito becomes more plausible. There is as so far unexplained graffito in the obverse field in front of the face.

Few people, in the course of history, have conditioned by their decisions the path of the generations to come. Constantine the Great is one of these. To come back to his life is in our opinion needless, since so plentiful is the literature on this subject, but surely it is worth remembering that our daily actions, our way of living and thinking are somehow the result of the vision he had, while dreaming, the night before the battle of the Milvian Bridge (312). From the numismatic point of view, Constantine I has two great merits: the first is to having put an end, with his supremacy, to the monetary chaos of the Tetrarchy, and the second, but not the least, is that having left, as testimony of his thirty years of reign, a large number of masterpieces of numismatic art. The NAC is therefore proud to offer today for sale the gold medallion of 9 solidi, above described, struck at Trewiri in the summer of 310 to commemorate the anniversary of Constantine's rise to power. The specimen, unique, is the largest known multiple of this emperor, and comes from the famous hoard of Beaurains-lez-Arras, in northern France, found in 1922 by some Belgian workmen. Luckily the panegyric delivered on the occasion of the Quinquennalia has survived, thus allowing a precise dating of the piece.

During those celebrations it was custom for the sovereign to distribute the medallion to selected individuals, civilian and military alike. The presence in the hoard of some 30 to 35 multiples, of which, as already said, ours is the largest surviving, and the choice of the reverse types directly alluding to the army, tells us that the recipient must have been a very prominent officer, such as a legionary or Praetorian Guard commander.

Since there were also more than 700 coins, together with various jewels, necklaces, gems, it is plausible to assume that the treasure as a whole belonged to the wealthy family residing in Gaul, of some higher personage of the army who was presented, during its service, with some of the medallions as marks of distinction.

She is depicted in what was for the metropolitan Roman typically uncivilized garb, leather trousers and a jerkin, and a so-called Phrygian hat. Also noteworthy is the half-length metallic portrait of Crispus.






