This specimen, by far the best known for quality, permits unambiguous identification of this very rare and splendid coin. For the first time the obverse legend is clearly legible, and also the prey, originally identified by Calciati as a turtle, is definitely a hare. His misreading was surely due to the poor condition of the pieces known to him, the wear from long circulation effectively transforming the hare/rabbit into a lump-shaped form reminiscent of a turtle. Luckily, our specimen, besides being in superb condition, is also so sharply struck that the typical long ears of the hare/rabbit are easily recognisable.

The celebrated statue of the Tyche of Antioch, part of a group including statues of Seleucus Nikator and his son Antiochus I, was made in gilt bronze c. 300-290 by Eutychides of Sycion, pupil and fellow-townsmen of Lysippus, sculptor to Alexander the Great, and was widely copied in many sizes and materials, including here, where the Lysippian monument has been reduced to a chinless lumpen divinity kicking a fallen boy's head.

In the summer of 281, the armies of Seleucus I of Syria met the forces of Lysimachus, advanced to repel the invader from his Asiatic provinces, for a final clash on the plains of Coropedium. In the ensuing battle the Thracian king met his death, and Seleucus found himself the sole ruler of Alexander's heritage.

The significance of the types of this issue, struck immediately after the victory, and not new to Seleucus coinage, is clearly of celebratory nature. Apart from an immediate and easy reference to the well-known Bucephalus, and therefore to everything Alexandrine, the horned horse may well refer to Seleucus' own mount, to whose swiftness in past perilous circumstances he owed his life. The horns, a divine attribute, specially among Oriental people, further stress the importance given to the animal. Besides, it should not be forgotten that Seleucus was for some time after the death of Alexander the commander of the "Hetairoi", the Household Cavalry.

The elephant obviously recalls the trump card of the Seleucid army, which made heavy use of these mighty animals. Clearly the horse / elephant association must be seen as a special recognition of the role of the cavalry and the elephant corps in the battle.

This issue, ostensibly struck only at Pergamum, is exceedingly rare, having had a very short life since Seleucus was assassinated by Ptolemy Ceranus only seven months after the victory of Coropedium.

Our specimen, however, seems not to belong to Pergamum: it shows monograms unrecorded for this city, but attributable to another western Seleucid mint. Perhaps, considering the propagandistic intent of the issue, it was Seleucus' idea to begin production of this type at other locations as well, as a means of impressing his newly acquired subjects. Be that as it may, the plan was abandoned in the wake of Seleucus' sudden death.

The placing of Augustus' head is very unusual, neither to left nor to right, but facing, within a circular frame in turn enclosed by laurel wreath. The typology appears to resemble that of the *imagines clipeatae*, known both in painting and in sculpture, i.e. portraits within a *clipeus* (round shield), where the roundness of the shield supplies the frame. It is a kind of portrait that appeared originally in Greece, persisted in the Hellenistic Age and also spread to Rome; it included the use of *imago clipeata* in metal, also attended by Pompeian paintings (House of Vettii, House of *Impluvium*), where they appear hanging on walls and columns. From the *Res gestae Divi Augusti* we learn of the dedication in 28-27 BC of a gold shield, inscribed with the four "cardinal virtues" of Augustus, to the Curia, near the Altar of the Victory. Augustus explicitly says, in his *Res Gestae* (chapt. 34): "During my sixth and seventh consulate, after having put an end to the civil wars, [having] by universal consent taken upon myself control of all state affairs, I returned the government of the Republic from my power to the free will of the Senate and of the Roman People. For this merit of mine, the title of Augustus was bestowed on me by Senate decree, the gate of my house was publicly adorned with laurel, and a civic wreath was affixed to the entrance; a gold shield was placed in the Curia Iulia with an inscription proclaiming that it was offered to me by the Senate and the Roman People in recognition of my valour, of my mercifulness, of my equity and piousness". As to the presence of Mars on the reverse of the coin, it helps to remember the acts of Augustus (as related by Suetonius: Aug 18): "To hand down to posterity the memory of the victory at Actium, he founded close to this city [the city of Nicopolis, and instigated the quinquennial games there; [having] enlarged the temple of Apollo, he consecrated the place of his encampment to Mars and Neptune, after its embellishment with naval trophies". The peculiar protection given by Mars to the Gens Octavia is frequently attested by Suetonius who, at the beginning of his "Life of Augustus" says: "much evidence reminds us that the Gens Octavia were once among the first of the Velletri. In fact, in the most densely-populated part of the town, an alley was already known in ancient times as the "Octavian alley", and contained an altar dedicated to a certain Octavius. A commander in a war with a neighbouring tribe, Octavius was informed of an enemy raid while he was sacrificing to Mars. On receiving the news, he took away the half-raw entrails and cut them; thus he went into battle, and won. There was also a public decree ordering future sacrifices to Mars to be made in the same fashion, with subsequent delivery of the remnants to the Octavii".

With the inflow of Dacian gold, Trajan was able to start an active policy of public works, culminating in the building of the Forum named after him. The huge complex, located between the Quirinal and the Capitol, included in order the forensic square (with the equestrian statue of Trajan), the Basilica Ulpia, a courtyard with arcades (with the great cochlis, or helical, column, surviving), the two libraries (with Trajan's private archives and a collection of decrees of praetors) and the temple of the *Divus Traianus*.

The reverse of the aureus at issue shows the central entrance with three fornices (whereas the other two, at sides, had one fornyx only) opening on its long side overlooking the Forum.

The three fornices appear framed by columns and crowned by equestrian groups, the frontal quadriga (likely Trajan's triumphal one) prominent among them. The basilica, named *Ulpia* after Trajan's *gens*, had a rectangular plan (m. 159 x 55) with two great apses on the short sides: inside it had a nave and double aisles divided by granite and cipolin colonnades. Besides the judicial and commercial functions of the Basilica, built in 113 by the architect Apollodorus of Damascus (to whom the whole monumental complex is also due), the S.O. apse (dedicated to the *Libertas*) was also used for the ceremony of the freeing of slaves (*manumissio*). The basilica is likewise mentioned in the *Historia Augusta* (*Comm. 2, 1*) for a *congiarium* (distribution of victuals and money) at the time of Commodus.

The coin, with the indication COS III, takes us to the year 120 AD, when the emperor Hadrian, present in Rome from 118 AD (after the settlement of oriental frontiers and the reinforcing of the <i>pax romana</i> and before 121, year of the beginning of a long series of inspections of the provinces that kept him mainly far from Rome up to 134) was attending to the reorganization of the imperial administration and judicature. The reverse of the aureus, with the sacrifice scene and the VOTA PVBLICA legend, confirm Hadrian's observance of traditional religion, attested from sources: his careful restoration of temples and myths in fact puts him close to Augustus. On the occasion of the <i>vota publica</i> the magistrate, in the name of the state, pledged himself to offer to the god or gods either sacrifices or games or a temple or the dedication of an altar or a share in the spoils or some other offering, if the god, for his part, granted his help for obtaining some success, for winning a war, for warding off a famine or a pestilence.

Commodus' father, Marcus Aurelius, reinstated the dynastic criterion, instead of the adoptive one, in choosing his heir as emperor – a decision that proved detrimental to the good of the State. Commodus, suspicious and easily influenced by nature, was at the heart of a plot in 182 that lead to a cruel repression, while the Empire was undergoing a period of famine and pestilence, uprisings, misappropriations and progressive economic crisis. One of the areas of greater unrest was Britain, which had already given Marcus Aurelius some concern and to which the reverse of our medallion refers. In 184 a barbarian raid through the Wall overcame an envoy with his troops; the situation was restored with some difficulty by the gallant Ulpius Marcellus. Commodus received the VII imperatorial salutation (attested by the legend on our reverse) and the title of *Britannicus*.

Fulvia Plautilla, daughter of Gaius Fulvius Plautianus, prefect of Septimius Severus' praetorium, was married to Caracalla in 202 (when he was still associated with Augustus), receiving the title of Augusta, which appears on our aureus. Herodian (who wrote in Greek a "History of the Roman empire after Marcus Aurelius") tells us as follows: "Antoninus was not at all happy with this wedding; married by force rather than by his own choosing, he was hostile to the girl and her father; thus they shared neither the bed nor the house, in short he loathed her. In fact he threatened to kill her at any moment, together with her father, as soon as he would have become the sole ruler. All these things the girl duly referred to her father; by informing him minutely of her hateful married life, she aroused his anger" (cf. Herodian III 10). After that Severus (imitating what had previously been done by Augustus to the children of Antonius, already his sworn enemy) had Plautilla banished to Sicily (cf. Herodian III 13). Once Caracalla became emperor (211 AD) he "had the daughter of Plautianus, who had been his wife, killed" (cf. Herodian IV 6). Plautilla's hairstyle design is remarkable from an iconographic viewpoint.

This coin, of exceptional iconographical and documentary value, shows on the reverse the features of the *Nymphaeum divi Alexandri*, one of the three nymphaea explicitly listed by name (the others are the *Nymphaea Tria* on the Aventine and the *Nymphaeum Iovis* beneath the present-day Piazza S. Silvestro) of the fifteen assessed in the city of Rome, according to the catalogue of the *regiones* of the fourth century AD.

The nymphaeum (or monumental fountain) of Alexander Severus has been identified with the imposing brick structure, known as "Trophies of Marius", for the presence of two marble reliefs of the age of Domitian (removed in 1590 and carried onto the baluster of the Capitol, where they still remain). The enormous fountain, which was once covered with marble ornaments, today rises at the northern corner of Piazza Vittorio Emanuele II (at the fork of the Labicana and Collatina streets) and is fed by the *Aqua Julia* (of which was exactly the "Mostra"). The fountain features a trapezoidal plan, expanding on three tiers in the style of the *scenae frons*, (i.e. imitating the stage-front prospect of the playhouse), with a large central niche (reminiscent of the monument of Philopappus in Athens), and two minor side niches, containing two great marble trophies. A semi-circular basin in the foreground was used for drawing the water falling from above.

The "water supply" is due to Alexander Severus, whose other credits include the rebuilding in 227 AD of the Thermae of Nero (later known as the *Thermae Alexandrinae*) at the Campo Marzio, NW of the Pantheon. These achievements in civil engineering are summarised in the "Life of Alexander Severo" (chap. 25) contained in the *Historia Augusta*, as follows: "He rebuilt the edifices raised by his predecessors and saw to the erecting of many others, including the Thermae named after him, sited next to the old Thermae of Nero and fed by the aqueduct now called Alexandrine".

Marcus Antonius Florianus, brother of Tacitus on his mother's side, accompanied the emperor in the office of *praefectus praetorii* as he set out for Asia Minor to fight the Goths. When his step-brother died, Florian succeeded him on the imperial rank, hailed by the troops. However, he died shortly afterwards at Tarsus in 276, while preparing for the war against Probus (set up against him by Syrian legions). He was most likely killed by his own soldiers, who had been struck by a pestilence. Notwithstanding the information we have from sources that depict him bald, Florian is represented on the coin with short hair, evenly spread on the skullcap, a similarly short beard, and an expression exuding strength and determination.

Marcus Aurelius Probus, born at Sirmium in 232, embarked on a military career that eventually put him in charge of the eastern zone.
At the death of Tacitus he was hailed emperor and opposed to Florian, of whom he got the better. For his many victories he was honoured with the epithets of *Germanicus Maximus* and *Gothicus Maximus*. He was killed at Sirmium, his home town, by his own soldiers, intolerant of the strict discipline enforced upon them by the emperor.
Our aureus shows the vigorous portrait of a strong-willed man.

Nos. 528-530 illustrate through Herculean mythology the <i>virus</i> of the invincible warrior, <i>debellator</i> , embodied by Augustus Maximian, who bore the political title of Herculius. Through his Caesar Constantius, rather than in person, he conquered the low countries tribes of the Chamavi, Batavians and Frisians in 293, and resettled them on Roman territory. The Argive legend of the innocent deer of Ceryneia refers to this "gentle" form of warfare: Hercules captured the deer unharmed for Eurystheus, who released it back to Artemis, a wild thing tamed. The centaur, driven mad by the scent of wine, is one of those slain by Hercules at Pholos' cave, and, uncontrollably savage, symbolises the type of barbarism depicted on the Republican triens, Cr. 39 and no. 8 above, struck exactly five hundred and ten years before. The hero's slaughter of the hydra, a species of dragon or kakadaimon and therefore emblematic of malice and revolt, may allude to the recovery in 293 of Carausius' continental possession rather than to polymorphic tribalism. This seems all the more likely because the type was revived this year after a period of disuse going back to Postumus. All three coins seem to have been struck in Maximian's decennial year.

Galerius Valerius Maximianus built his military career under Aurelian and Probus: he was proclaimed Augustus by Diocletianus, perhaps on the 1st of April 286, and was entrusted with the government and the defence of the Danubian provinces and the Balkan peninsula.

The unsuccessful attempt to reconquer Britain from the usurper Carausius obliged Diocletianus to form the tetrarchic system, assigning Constantius Chlorus as Caesar to Maximianus. Thus Maximianus began fighting the Mauretanian rebel tribes in Africa, in the confrontation of 297-298.

The portrait of Maximianus in the medallion seems to have undergone a process of idealisation: the head of Augustus bears a lion-skin, the nose acquires a more regular contour (neither hooked nor flattened), while the face is framed by a ring of beard and the chin appears strong.

The motif of the *pellis leonina* (the Nemean lion, strangled by Heracles in one of his twelve labours), proclaims the figure of *Hercules Comes*, standing with his typical attributes (the bow and the club) on the reverse. By adopting the name "Herculean", Maximianus credited his continuing power to the special divine protection afforded to the hero of the Roman-Italic tradition.

On 21st September 1922, a cache of treasure (the so-called Arras hoard) was unearthed by Belgian workmen in the territory of Beaurains (northern France). It contained several hundred gold and silver coins, some forty gold medallions, jewels, cameos and various silverware, most likely having belonged to the family of a very high officer serving in Gaul. Part of the hoard went to the market, while a good share ended up in the Arras Museum.

The piece we are proud to offer here today belonged to Sir Arthur Evans, one of the founding fathers of Minoic archeology, who dedicated a long memoir (NC 1930, pp. 221-274) just to this medallion.

Remarkable from the iconographic point of view is the portrait of Constantius Chlorus (*Chlorus*, "with pale complexion", the nickname given him by Byzantine writers because of his delicate health; confirmed, from the Latin side, also by Lactatianus): strong head, long nose curved at middle, conspicuous superciliary brow, protruding massive chin, beard and hair cut short after the fashion of the tetrarchs.

During the first tetrarchy, set up by Diocletian, Constantius, adopted by Maximianus, was Caesar from the 1st of March 293 to the 1st of May 305 (abdication of Maximianus), with his diocese in Gaul. The medallion is therefore ascribed to the first four months of 305 and celebrates the *temporum felicitas*, a propagandistic theme of the late empire, which finds significant development in some *Panegyrici Latini* (a collection of eleven encomia dedicated to the emperors, going from 289 to 389 AD). The V (*Incerti Panegyricus Cinstatio Caesari dictus*) of 297 signifies Constantius Chlorus, father of Constantine the Great (to whom as many as four panegyrics in the sylloge are addressed), and celebrates the *felicitas imperatorum* (cf. *Paneg. V* 15) following the "lucky" landing of Constantius in Britain, which led to the defeat and death, in 296, of the usurper Allectus.

The coin provides us with a portrait of Severus II, all the more interesting if one considers that the image of this emperor is known to us only from monetary issues.

Our aureus brings us back to the time when Severus was Caesar of the Augustus Constantius Chlorus (1 May 305), before being elevated to the rank of Augustus (25th July 306).

The future emperor, of Illyrian origin, is represented here with a very high forehead, mouth tightly shut, round eyes. The expression is youthful. He was killed in 307 by order of Maxentius during the war with Galerius.

Flavius Iulius Crispus, first-born and illegitimate son of Constantine the Great, was appointed Caesar in March 317, and celebrated the fifth anniversary of his nomination to Caesar (Quinquennalia) in 321, the year after his participation in the war against the Franks. In 324 he successfully fought against Licinius and in July 326 was killed at Pola, by order of his father Constantine, in puzzling circumstances that can be linked, perhaps, with the death of his step-mother, Fausta Fausta, a few months later. An incestuous relationship between the two has been contemplated, even if other sources have conjectured Constantine's jealousy of his son's mounting military prestige or some other, more serious reason for dissent. The portrait on the coin shows a beautiful laureate profile of the Caesar, depicting his frail and delicate look.


