Auktionsbedingungen

Durch die Teilnahme an der Auktion werden die folgenden Bedingungen anerkannt:

1. Die Versteigerung erfolgt in Schweizer Franken. 1. Auction bidding is conducted in Swiss Francs. The highest bidder who has been acknowledged by the auctioneer when the hammer falls after the third call, has legally bought the lot (for e-auctions there will be a virtual auctioneer). Bidding usually begins at 80% of the estimate, provided no higher offers have been submitted. Written bids have priority over telephone and electronic bids. The successful bidder has committed himself personally to the purchases made. He cannot claim to have acted on behalf of a third party.
2. Absentee bidders can send bids electronically until the start of the sale. Bidders wishing to send a written bid by email, fax or participate by telephone must send their bids no later than 24 hours before the start of the auction. All bids are final and binding. Telephone bidders must agree that calls may be recorded. The auction house does not take responsibility for bidding mandates made by telephone, electronically or in writing.
3. Bidders must show proof of identification before the auction, and subsequently register. The Auction House may require a bank reference and/or guarantee. The Auction House reserves the right to deny a person from participating in the auction.
4. The auctioneer may raise or reject a bid without giving a reason. Furthermore, they have the right to combine, separate, and offer catalogue lots in a different order, as well as omit or withdraw them from the auction.
5. A commission of 22.5% will be levied on the hammer price - bidders using our Live Internet facilities pay an additional charge of 1%. The Swiss value added tax (VAT) of 8.1% is payable on the final price (hammer price, plus buyer's commission and any other amounts chargeable by the Auction House to the buyer). **Gold coins (AV) are exempt from VAT.**

If the purchases are exported, then the VAT will be refunded on production of a legally valid original export declaration issued by Swiss Customs.

6. Payment in Swiss Francs is due immediately upon adjudication of the lot and has to be paid with the release of the object to the Buyer, unless otherwise agreed in writing before the sale. Late payments will be subject to a monthly default interest of 1%. The ownership of a lot will not pass to the Buyer until NAC has received full payment on their account. Any fees and charges payable abroad are borne by the buyer (successful bidder) who is responsible for acquiring the necessary information on any applicable customs and foreign exchange regulations. The Auction House accepts no liability for any contraventions of such regulations.

8. The Buyer undertakes not to export the purchased goods to countries or territories subject to economic sanctions, embargoes, or other trade restrictions imposed by the Swiss Confederation. Furthermore, the Buyer undertakes not to transfer or make available the purchased goods to individuals or entities that are subject to sanctions imposed by the Swiss Confederation, and to comply with all current Swiss regulations regarding export and sanctions.

9. All identifications and descriptions of the items sold in this catalogue are statements of opinion and were made in good faith. Should an item sold later be found to be a fake, NAC shall cancel the sale made on behalf of the consignor and refund the sale's price (including VAT as applicable) to the buyer. The buyer is entitled to claim such a refund within a period of two years from the date of the auction, provided that they have notified NAC of the defect by registered letter within 5 days from its detection.

10. The objects which come under the hammer are auctioned on behalf of a third party or are property of the Auction House. Foreword Andrew McCabe

Four decades of evolution are invested into this, my collection of Roman Republican coins, and are reflected in its present state coverage, rarity, provenance, condition, strike, and patina. For much of this time I used Robert Carson's, *Principal Coins of the Romans*, as my model of a perfectly displayed collection, and I encourage collectors who would like a guide on how to balance coverage and rarity in assembling a collection to acquire Carson's three volume series, *The Republic, Principate and Dominate*, British Museum, London 1978-81.

The collection has passed through several distinct stages but there might have been some shortcuts had I known how important demonstrable provenance would become in time. In the 1980s I collected whatever Roman Republican denarii looked interesting and were available in retail shops and through retail offerings of Baldwin's, Seaby, Spink etc. My mentor at the time – everyone needs a mentor – was Thomas Beverley Curtis at Baldwin's who would say "buy this coin, you won't regret it"; I recall him being pleased that I was interested in rare varieties and not just in condition: Mr. Curtis regularly said that collectors who only focused on condition and didn't consider patina, provenance, rarity etc, were missing out on a great deal of interesting coins. I discovered NAC auctions in the 1990s, and the quality of my coins improved. Early NAC sales included great coverage of Roman Republican bronzes and I started forming an all-metals collection, including aes grave, silver, struck and cast bronzes. I made many mistakes – I bought an EID MAR denarius of Brutus, in poor condition but evidently genuine, and sold it some years later on the basis that it was a fairly common type and I would soon find one in VF or better. I didn't. Oh dear. For the record, here it is:



Some collecting areas, adjacent to the Roman Republic, proved too difficult to play a serious role in. These included the Social War, the Restoration Coinage of Trajan, and the Fleet Coinage of Mark Antony. I didn't at the time know that Richard Witschonke was assembling the world's best collection of Mark Antony Fleet Coinage, which he was to donate to the American Numismatic Society.

In the early 2000's my collection entered a new phase - I set myself the impossible task of collecting every Roman Republican coin type in all metals, regardless of condition. Many coins cost 50 dollars or less. I added 48 coins in 2001, 99 in 2002, 147 in 2003 growing to 285 new coins in 2009, and a peak of 310 new coins in 2013. I was adding a new coin to my collection every one to three days for two decades. The numbers were extraordinary. Over my entire collecting career I have owned perhaps 5000 Roman Republican coins, a rather similar number to the collection sizes of Richard Schaefer, Richard B Witschonke and Roberto Russo who all became firm friends in this time. My study collection of Roman Republican bronzes enabled me to do serious research work and I was honoured that Roberto Russo invited me to collaborate with him on a book on Roman Republican bronzes – forthcoming – and a special study on the coinage of Luceria and Canusium – published in the *Revue Belge de Numismatique*, 2024.

This study collection, mainly of bronzes but with many silver coins, was dispersed to collectors in the period 2013 to 2023, as I completed research on each series in turn. From the time of the RBW sales, 2012 and 2023, I focused on a new area: provenances, and have spent the last twelve years narrowing my collection down to the most important coins of the best possible provenances. This collection is so different from the study collection that I dispersed from 2013, that it is important for it to have a different name. Lambeth Bridge has a special association with luck in coins.



I have held two examples of this extremely rare type with retrograde legends, confirmed as official due to there being multiple dies across multiple denominations all with this legend form. My other example was, I discovered in 2015, illustrated in the second, 1898, volume of Max Bahrfeldt's *Nachträge und Berichtigungen zur Münzkunde der Römischen Republik*, pl.6, #123, which initially pleased me immensely until I realised the text cited 'Pesaro' and that the cited example in Crawford's RRC also cited 'Pesaro'. I reached out to the Museo Archeologico Oliveriano, who reported back that the coin had been missing since the mid 1980s, in a not widely published theft. Of course, I immediately arranged to have the coin returned to Pesaro, and as part of that return process I walked with the coin to a friend's office in London. I recall the day was spilling with rain. Somehow when I arrived, the coin was no longer in my pocket. I left the office and retraced my steps through the rain, back and forward over many miles, and unbelievably found the coin in its plastic flip on the pavement in the middle of Lambeth Bridge; the glint of the flip helped me see it in the rain. That Tituria quadrans is now safely back in Pesaro. A few weeks later I noticed another example of this coin being sold by David Hendin on behalf of Heidi Becker, Richard B. Witschonke's partner. I reached out and they jointly gifted me this coin. My entire coin collection is now named after this Lambeth Bridge find.

The sale of Richard B. Witschonke's collection, the RBW collection, in 2011-2012, put a new emphasis on documenting provenance in ancient coins. This coincided with the introduction of new import and export regulations for antiquities in various countries that laid emphasis on the importance of demonstrating provenance through old photographic sources. Thus began a relentless search for provenances for coins I already owned, and a focus on adding coins to my collection that were highly likely to have demonstrably excellent provenances. Whilst the newer import regulations covered only coins that were localised in one country and not international trade coins such as the Athenian tetradrachm or the Roman denarius which might be found anywhere from Scotland to India, my aim was to use the same rigour as the best public collections in the world might use. This required an entirely new library and new research tools and techniques.

The exact techniques used to find provenances are too complex to explain in this introduction, but it is worth noting that electronic means, in particular image matching, played almost no part at all. I put five hundred coins through one or other image matching websites and scored perhaps three useful hits not already known to me through conventional search techniques, and those not very useful at that – obscure sales in the 1990s. This will improve but as of now, a physical library remains of great value to the provenance researcher.

As I sifted out better and better coins and completed the disposal of my study collection coins, the nature of my collection changed, reducing in size and improving in quality and provenance and this collection is presented with its tickets and ephemera in this book. I leave you with one very typical provenance: noting that every occurrence in a past book or sale is documented with a photograph from the original source.

The collection tickets displayed in this book contain many easter eggs in the form of small sterling silver tickets bearing the name of a Roman moneyer. I acquired this group of tickets a decade ago, evidently some were used to mark coin trays in a large collection and have now dispersed these among my coins.

I leave you with one very typical provenance: noting that every occurrence in a past book or sale is documented with a photograph from the original source.

Foreword Arturo Russo

Over the years, Numismatica Ars Classica has sold a great number of Roman Republican coin collections. While Andrew McCabe's Lambeth Bridge collection may not be the most extensive or complete, it is certainly one of the dearest to us for a combination of reasons. Andrew McCabe is not only an avid collector but also, and most importantly, a scholar who has made significant contributions to the study of struck bronze coinage of the Roman Republic.

This (sadly) rather neglected field of numismatics is particularly dear to me, as it was the focus of my father's collection—the largest in the world in this category. My father dedicated the last few years of his life to compiling an organic corpus, which Andrew is helping us complete with his great expertise, and we hope that this will soon be printed.

Returning to Andrew, as he himself wrote in his preface, the group of coins that form this catalogue are the result of a continuous process of filtering and refining over the years. Over time, Andrew has increasingly focused his attention on coins with distinguished provenances, prioritising this above all other criteria: the reason for this being not only the prestige associated with the provenance but also the fact that he has always found that a coin with an old cabinet tone and not recently cleaned metal was more attractive than an "as struck" coin without a patina.

Often, his acquisitions have been driven by the needs of his research, and his extensive knowledge has enabled him to discover some remarkable rarities in smaller auctions. The result is a highly appealing group of coins, enriched by small gems often originating from the collection of Richard B. Witschonke (RBW), with whom Andrew shared a close friendship founded on mutual respect and scholarly collaboration.

Andrew's dedication and passion for numismatics will not end with the sale of this collection; rather, he will continue to devote his time to the field in his natural way – by writing articles and books on Republican coins in general, and on struck bronze coinage in particular.

I have held two examples of this extremely rare type with retrograde legends, confirmed as official due to there being multiple dies across multiple denominations all with this legend form. My other example was, I discovered in 2015, illustrated in the second, 1898, volume of Max Bahrfeldt's *Nachträge und Berichtigungen zur Münzkunde der Römischen Republik*, pl.6, #123, which initially pleased me immensely until I realised the text cited 'Pesaro' and that the cited example in Crawford's RRC also cited 'Pesaro'. I reached out to the Museo Archeologico Oliveriano, who reported back that the coin had been missing since the mid 1980s, in a not widely published theft. Of course I immediately arranged to have the coin returned to Pesaro, and as part of that return process I walked with the coin to a friend's office in London. I recall the day was spilling with rain. Somehow when I arrived, the coin was no longer in my pocket. I left the office and retraced my steps through the rain, back and forward over many miles, and unbelievably found the coin in its plastic flip on the pavement in the middle of Lambeth Bridge; the glint of the flip helped me see it in the rain. That Tituria quadrans is now safely back in Pesaro. A few weeks later I noticed another example of this coin being sold by David Hendin on behalf of Heidi Becker, Richard B. Witschonke's partner. I reached out and they jointly gifted me this coin. My entire coin collection is now named after this Lambeth Bridge find.





The reverse of this denarius is famous and controversial. According to one interpretation, it represents Sulla lying asleep and dreaming with the contents of his dream standing around him. Plutarch tells us that before Sulla's infamous march on Rome in 88 B.C., "there appeared in his dreams a goddess whom the Romans learned to worship from the Cappadocians, whether she is Luna, or Minerva, or Bellona. This goddess, as Sulla fancied, stood by his side and put into his hand a thunderbolt, and naming his enemies one by one, bade him smite them with it; and they were all smitten, and fell, and vanished away. Encouraged by the vision, he told it to his colleague, and at break of day led on towards Rome." Luna, clearly identified by a crescent on her forehead, stands before the sleeping figure on the right while Victory stands behind him on the left. Both seem to represent elements of the dream as recorded by Plutarch. However, the use of Sulla's dream as a type by L. Aemilius Buca has been challenged on the grounds that he was an appointee of Julius Caesar and therefore linked to the populares political faction of Rome, while Sulla is thought to have become virtually an emblem of the opposition optimiate faction. On the assumption that Sulla's dream was politically inappropriate, the type is instead understood to represent the myth of Endymion, a young Greek shepherd who was beloved by Selene (Roman Luna) that she begged Zeus to permit him to retain his youth and sleep forever so that she could look upon him every night. While this interpretation explains the sleeping figure and the presence of Luna, it does not easily account for Victory. She has little to do with the Endymion myth, but a great deal to do with Sulla. This fact, combined with increasing understanding that the populares and optimates were not the same as modern political parties and lacked unified policies and ideologies, makes it seem more likely that the dream of Sulla is indeed represented here.

This coin marks the beginning of the monarchical behaviour that would cause many members of the senatorial class to turn against Julius Caesar and assassinate him on the Ides of March. The Romans were long opposed to all trappings of kingship both in memory of the expulsion of Tarquinus Superbus, which allowed for the creation of the Roman Republic, and as a practical means of preventing the subversion of that republic. As a feature of this old anti-regal policy, it was Roman custom to never depict a living man on their coins, because this would be too much like the practices of contemporary Hellenistic kings. It was therefore very shocking to the public, and especially individuals of strong republican sentiment, when denarii like this began coming out of the mint in early 44 BC. The obverse is a clear portrait of Caesar as dictator for the fourth time executed in an excellent veristic style that does not shy away from representing his physical flaws. Due to the quality of its execution, this is probably the most desirable issue of all of Caesar's portrait coins. The dictator is shown here with the corona aurea awarded for his triumphs, but which he took to wearing at all times to cover up his increasing baldness. A lituus, the staff of the augur, appears behind the neck specifically advertises his appointment as a member of the college of augurs in 47 BC, but may also allude in more general terms to Caesar's religious roles. He had been pontifex in 73 BC and previous religious positions as pontifex maximus in 63 BC, and showed a great interest in using his sacred roles as a means of bolstering the legitimacy of his sole rule. The reverse type features Juno Sospita and represents the influence of the moneyer M. Mettius on the coin design. Juno Sospita ("the Saviour") was a form of the important goddess that was especially venerated in the Latin city of Lanuvium, the ancestral home of the gens Mettia. She was adopted into the Roman pantheon early on and had her own temple on the Palatine Hill in the fourth century BC. This nod to Mettius' family represents a last gasp for traditional moneyers as types related to Caesar came to dominate both sides of the coins. The disappearance of moneyers' influence on Roman coins only accelerated after his death and the coming of the civil wars resulting the creation of the Empire.

Although the Morcom, Hands and Wertheim catalogue doesn't distinguish which coins belonged to which collector, the foreword notes that Colonel R. H. Morcom of Bromsgrove collected Roman Imperial coins with a special focus on portraits, and mentions Rev. A.W. Hands of London's speciality in Roman Republican coins. The third cited collector is Julius Edward Wertheim of Berlin (1880 – 1928) a Polish pianist, conductor and composer. This portrait aureus may have been within Morcom's area of interest, so it's impossible to say which of the three consignments it came from.

The portrait aurei of 42 B.C. are devoted to the three members of the second triumvirate – Octavian, Antony and Lepidus. All were produced by four moneyers, Clodius, Mussidius, Varus and Regulus, and Buttrey's proposal that the four moneyers struck in the same year has generally been accepted. Each moneyer struck portrait aurei for each triumvir, making it a comprehensive series. The aurei of L. Livineius Regulus are unique within the group because they are not die linked with coins of the other three moneyers. This aspect, taken with the unusual characteristics of some of Regulus' silver coins, allowed Buttrey to argue that Regulus was the primus, or leading member, of the college of four moneyers. If so, the coins of Regulus may have been struck first, with those of Clodius, Mussidius and Varus following in a manner that allowed them to be die linked among each other. Based upon the inscription PRAEF.VR on one of Regulus' denarii, Buttrey suggests Regulus was serving as the praefect of the city of Rome in 42 B.C., and that his duties included control of the coinage when consuls were absent. Thus, Regulus out of necessity may have become one of the moneyers so he could perform his expanded duties as praefect. Regulus' portrait aurei were carefully conceived, as the reverse type associated with each triumvir refers to the divine forbearers of the men: Octavian claimed descent from Venus, which is implied by Regulus' type of Aeneas carrying Anchises; Lepidus counted Mars among his ancestors, which is alluded to by his type depicting the Vestal Virgin Aemilia; and Antony is said to have been descended from Hercules, who is shown on the aurei Regulus produced for him. As Buttrey points out, offering descent from a divinity as a qualification for authority was not original to this series; similar overtures had been made on earlier coinage by Sulla (with Venus), Pompey (with Neptune) and Julius Caesar (with Venus). However, Regulus' coins show a strengthening of that trend, and imply that "...the Fortune of the city was to be assured by divinity as it were made flesh." The portrait die of this specimen was paired only with one reverse die, assuring us that it did not have a particularly long life. Stylistically it is perhaps the finest of all the Antony portrait dies employed by these moneyers. The inscription IIII VIR A P F is instructive, if not entirely clear. It almost certainly abbreviates quatuorviri argento publico feriendo or quattuorvir auro publico feriendo, with the latter representing the first time gold was included as part of the regular issues – something of a landmark in the development of Roman coinage.

While Crawford dates this issue to 43-42 B.C., Sear refines the dating to the second meeting of Brutus and Cassius which took place at Sardis during the summer of 42 B.C. and which ultimately led to the final confrontation with Octavian. According to Plutarch, the meeting took place behind closed doors, which shows the strains of their partnership, but the pair's mutual recriminations were settled and the duo resolved their differences. The precise design of the shield attached to the trophy on the reverse follows that of the slightly earlier denarius of the propraetorian legate, C. Flav. Hemic. (Crawford 504/1), which was struck at a mobile military mint travelling with Brutus in Lycia while he was subjecting the cities of Xanthus and Patara, as does the change in form of Brutus' name and title from proconsul to imperator. The head of Libertas, the personification of individual freedom and whose name had served as the watchword during the first Battle of Philippi, is ideally paired with the trophy and arms of the reverse, and was the principal theme of the Republican's coinage. The design includes the name of the legate responsible for the coinage, Marcus Servilius, who had personally served in Lycia campaigns and was perhaps present at the fall of both Xanthus and Patara. One highly unusual aspect of this issue, which consists of both aurei and denarii, is that while by no means common, the aurei are considerably more plentiful than the denarii, of which just a handful are known.
