Auktionsbedingungen

Durch die Teilnahme an der Auktion werden die folgenden Bedingungen anerkannt:

1. Die Versteigerung erfolgt in Schweizer Franken. Der Zuschlag erfolgt nach dreimaligem Aufruf an den Höchstbietenden, dessen Gebot vom Auktionator (für elektronische (online) Auktionen: virtueller Auktionator) anerkannt wurde, und verpflichtet zur Annahme. The following terms and conditions are accepted by all persons participating in the auction:

1. Auction bidding is conducted in Swiss Francs. The highest bidder who has been acknowledged by the auctioneer when the hammer falls after the third call, has legally bought the lot (for e-auctions there will be a virtual auctioneer). Bidding usually begins at 80% of the estimate, provided no higher offers have been submitted. Written bids have priority over telephone and electronic bids. The successful bidder has committed himself personally to the purchases made. He cannot claim to have acted on behalf of a third party.
2. Absentee bidders can send bids electronically until the start of the sale. Bidders wishing to send a written bid by email, fax or participate by telephone must send their bids no later than 24 hours before the start of the auction. All bids are final and binding. Telephone bidders must agree that calls may be recorded. The auction house does not take responsibility for bidding mandates made by telephone, electronically or in writing.
3. Bidders must show proof of identification before the auction, and subsequently register. The Auction House may require a bank reference and/or guarantee. The Auction House reserves the right to deny a person from participating in the auction.
4. The auctioneer may raise or reject a bid without giving a reason. Furthermore, they have the right to combine, separate, and offer catalogue lots in a different order, as well as omit or withdraw them from the auction.
5. A commission of 22.5% will be levied on the hammer price - bidders using our Live Internet facilities pay an additional charge of 1%. The Swiss value added tax (VAT) of 8.1% is payable on the final price (hammer price, plus buyer's commission and any other amounts chargeable by the Auction House to the buyer). **Gold coins (AV) are exempt from VAT.**

If the purchases are exported, then the VAT will be refunded on production of a legally valid original export declaration issued by Swiss Customs.
6. Payment in Swiss Francs is due immediately upon adjudication of the lot and has to be paid with the release of the object to the Buyer, unless otherwise agreed in writing before the sale. Late payments will be subject to a monthly default interest of 1%. The ownership of a lot will not pass to the Buyer until NAC has received full payment on their account. 8. The Buyer undertakes not to export the purchased goods to countries or territories subject to economic sanctions, embargoes, or other trade restrictions imposed by the Swiss Confederation. 9. All identifications and descriptions of the items sold in this catalogue are statements of opinion and were made in good faith. Should an item sold later be found to be a fake, NAC shall cancel the sale made on behalf of the consignor and refund the sale's price (including VAT as applicable) to the buyer. The buyer is entitled to claim such a refund within a period of two years from the date of the auction, provided that they have notified NAC of the defect by registered letter within 5 days from its detection.

Foreword Christian Stoess

In just nine years, from 1931 to 1939, this unique collection was assembled with a great love of coins, considerable expertise and, above all, virtually unlimited financial resources. It was a decade marked by the most severe economic and political upheavals since Napoleon's time. It was the turmoil of this period that made it possible to build this collection, aided by the disappearance of the main competitors on the coin market. Thus, the provenance history of the collection also reflects the history of the period.

The global economic crisis and Nazi tyranny led to massive upheavals in the coin trade. With the exception of Riechmann & Co., which fell into financial difficulties as a result of the global economic crisis, the leading German coin dealers in Europe were Jewish-owned (Robert Ball Nachf., Berlin; Adolph E. Cahn and Leo Hamburger, Frankfurt; Otto Helbing Nachf., Munich; Adolph Hess Nachf., Frankfurt; Jacob Hirsch, Munich; Sally Rosenberg, Frankfurt; Felix Schlessinger, Berlin). As a result of the repressive measures taken by the National Socialist regime, between 1933 and 1938 they either ceased to exist (Leo Hamburger, Sally Rosenberg), were relocated abroad (Cahn, Hess, Jacob Hirsch, Schlessinger), were Aryanised (Helbing) or sold to non-Jewish employees (Hess, Cahn). This vacuum primarily strengthened the already significant coin dealers in London (Baldwin and Spink & Son) and Amsterdam (J. Schulman). Our collector owes the development of his unique collection primarily to the trusting cooperation with these three coin dealers. His most important supplier was undoubtedly the Amsterdam coin dealer founded by Jacob Schulman and run by his sons André (+ 1936) and Maurits (+ 1943), which Jacob's grandson, Jacques Schulman (1906-1991), joined in 1927. Schulman had a worldwide network and access to the most important collections that came onto the market in the interwar period. From around 1933, but especially in the years 1936-1939, he offered the best pieces from these collections to our Traveller. Let's take a look at the most important collections that make up the Traveller collection.

Philipp la Renotière von Ferrari (1850–1917) was considered one of the wealthiest Europeans of his time. It is widely known that he assembled not only the largest stamp collection ever compiled, but also, less well known, a highly significant coin collection. Like our traveller later on, he visited the most renowned dealers around the world and acquired rarities for his collection. In the process, he developed a special love for Germany and Austria and, in addition to the French citizenship he acquired in 1871, later also took Austrian citizenship, a circumstance that sealed the fate of his collections, which were actually supposed to go to German and Austrian museums, when he died in 1917 during the First World War. The French state not only confiscated Ferrari's Hôtel Matignon in Paris, which at the time served as the Austrian embassy and housed large parts of the collections. Today, the building is the seat of the French Prime Minister, and the collections were sold. The collection of 19th-century German coins, the finest ever assembled, also contained numerous gold strikes of bronze and, above all, silver coins, most of which were produced at the mints from the original dies at Ferrari's request around the turn of the century. In the mid-1920s, this unique collection was handed over for auction to the Amsterdam coin dealer J. Schulman, who sold it on the market in four auctions between 1926 and 1929 without naming the previous owner. In the 1930s, the Traveller managed to acquire a considerable portion of the gold strikes from the Ferrari Collection.

Chicago brewery heir **Virgil M. Brand (1861–1926)** is considered the greatest coin collector of all time, with his universal collection comprising more than 360,000 items. His heirs, his brothers Armin W. and Horace L. Brand and, later, his niece Jane Brand Allen, sold large parts of his collection between 1937 and 1945, mostly through the coin dealer Burdette G. Johnson of St. Louis. The sales journals have been preserved, and J. Schulman from Amsterdam and Leonhard Forrer from Spink & Son in London occasionally appear as buyers, but never the Traveller directly (although he had noted the addresses of the Brand brothers in his notebook). Thus, the items from the Brand collection in this auction (nos. 1012, 1238 (?), 1362, 1385) were indirectly acquired by the Traveller. After the Second World War, further parts of the Brand collection came onto the market at various auction houses.

The **Würzburg Collection**, probably the most extensive collection of Würzburg gold coins ever assembled, was acquired by the traveller from J. Schulman on 16 June 1936. We do not know who was behind this collection, but it was assembled in the 1920s and 1930s by an unknown person with the help of J. Schulman and comprised no fewer than 167 Würzburg gold coins.



The most significant additions to the collection come from the collection of **Waldo Newcomer (1867-1934)**, chairman of the Atlantic Exchange Bank and Trust Company in Baltimore, which he founded. Newcomer, who was one of Baltimore's wealthiest citizens and had virtually unlimited funds at his disposal, is known to have assembled the largest collection of US coins that was not sold at auction. When his company ran into financial difficulties, he was forced to sell it to coin dealer B. Max Mehl in Fort Worth for \$250,000 in 1931. It is also known that he owned a collection of South American gold coins (Morgenthau auction, 12 February 1935) and several other coins (Morgenthau auctions, 23 February 1939 and 15 May 1941). On 26 March 1935, J. Schulman auctioned the 'Waldo Newcomer de Baltimore Collection' comprising 613 European gold coins, including several rarities. The Traveller was one of the major buyers at the auction and acquired the most important pieces in the collection (including the 100 ducat coin of Ferdinand III, our no. 1008). In the summer of 1936 (on 25 May, 16 and 19 June, and 25 July), Schulman repeatedly offered the Traveller large quantities of gold coins, from which he acquired the most important pieces. It can be assumed that these were also coins from the Newcomer collection. On 10-13 December 1936, during a visit to the Traveller's home, Schulman presented him with a selection of gold coins numbered from 1 to 7093, expressly from the Waldo Newcomer collection, from which the Traveller acquired almost 700, including all rarities (among them the 100 ducat coin from Poland from 1621, formerly, according to Newcomer, owned by the Pope, our No. 1396). Schulman thus appears to have been entrusted with the sale of the part of the Newcomer collection that did not contain US coins.

Foreword Arturo Russo

Following the resounding success of the first part of the Traveller's Collection, dedicated to English Milled coins, Numismatica Ars Classica is deeply honoured to present part II: Central, Eastern and Northern European Coins (part I).

This catalogue conveys, even more powerfully, the sheer scale and importance of this extraordinary collection and, thanks to the incredible research conducted by Christian Stoess, allows us to more fully understand and appreciate the astonishing history of its formation.

Through using the Traveller's diary, Christian has managed to not only trace the provenances of almost all the purchases made, but also to reconstruct earlier pedigrees back to the collections to which a great number of the coins formerly belonged before being sold privately by dealers. Thanks to this detective work, we see how our collector had not only purchased the most important coins sold at auctions during in the 1930s, but also how fortunate he had been to begin collecting at the exact time that some of the most prolific collectors of all time, such as Newcomer, Virgil Brandt and Ferrari de la Renonnière stopped. However, this by no means diminishes the extraordinary achievement of the Traveller, firstly because this has always been the nature of coin collecting, and secondly, because he did not allow these opportunities to elude him and he had the courage to privately purchase entire collections or the most important parts of them.

The German and Austro-Hungarian component is, along with the English part, arguably the largest and most important of the entire collection. Over time, the Traveller developed a clear competence as shown by his diary entries which Christian has rightly mentioned in the catalogue. As you will discover, this catalogue features countless coins of tremendous importance and it would be impossible to mention them all in this short foreword. Indeed, to do so would somewhat spoil the emotion that this catalogue will no doubt evoke with dozens of exceedingly rare coins, many of which have never appeared on the market or last appeared a century ago when the Traveller acquired them.

I would like to conclude with some words about the author who compiled this catalogue: Christian Stoess. Christian has done an outstanding job, delivering, as we were sure he would, a scientifically impeccable catalogue. Given his illustrious numismatic career and outstanding CV, we would have expected no less.

For those unfamiliar with Christian's background, his extensive knowledge of numismatics dates back to his childhood and Heinz Thormann was his first numismatic teacher. After graduating from high school in 1979, he began studying history at the University of Münster. He chose the Westphalian city because Peter Berghaus taught numismatics there. After completing his highly acclaimed Master of Arts degree with a thesis on '*Studies on the coinage history of the city of Lüneburg from the middle of the 16th century to the end of coinage (1777)*', followed by work on the project 'Coins found in Germany from the Roman period', in 1988 Christian was recruited by Dieter Raab of Dr Busso Peus Nachf. for their medieval and modern coin and medal departments. Since then, Christian has built an enduring reputation as one of the authorities on the Central European Coinage. He has been incredibly active in the field of research, development and promotion of numismatics, including his work as President of the Gesellschaft für Internationale Geldgeschichte and editor of the Geldgeschichtliche Nachrichten since 1992. In 2016 he received the honour of being appointed Research Associate at the Coin Cabinet of Berlin's Staatliche Museen where he has been responsible for the Medieval and early modern coins, and involved in exhibitions, publications and activities of the coin department. During his tenure in this prestigious post which he held until his retirement in April this year, Christian has worked tirelessly with his colleagues to more than double the number of objects published online. He will continue to write papers and be associated with the Coin Cabinet as an honorary employee.

Needless to say, working with Christian has been a privilege and a pleasure and we are delighted that this is only the first of a series of catalogues for which Christian will be responsible.

For now, as always, we will let the coins speak for themselves.

All coins and medals in this catalogue have been graded, as customary at Numismatica Ars Classica, using traditional descriptive grading.

For all coins struck after 1685, with the exception of the 100 Ducat piece of Ferdinand III (lot 1008), we have also decided to offer, alongside our own grades, third-party independent grading by NGC.

Where available, the two gradings are shown both in the printed catalogue and online. We have taken this direction because we believe that third-party grading is only truly accurate for milled coinage.

The variables inherent in hammered and early milled striking cannot be accurately reflected by a single numerical grade.

By contrast, our carefully reviewed descriptive grading provides a more faithful and nuanced representation of the coin's condition.

Needless to say, all coins and medals including the one struck prior to 1685 are guaranteed genuine.

In his 2011 corpus on Bohemian coins, Ivo Halačka classifies the three-emperor coins as having been minted under Emperor Matthias, contrary to his statement made in 1992 ('Die sog. Dreikaiser-Prägungen' aus den böhmischen Münzstätten" [The so-called three-emperor coins from the Bohemian mints], Haller Münzblätter V, 1992, No. 14/15), that minting under Emperor Rudolf II was already possible.

The coin is only present in the Vienna Coin Cabinet in a weight of 50 ducats; only the National Museum in Budapest and the Smithsonian Institution have a specimen weighing 100 ducats. Another 100-ducat coin was sold to Virgil Brand in the Horsky coll. 1910 for 3,300 marks, but it was in significantly poorer condition, the fourth known piece was offered at the Sotheby and Co. sale on 21 October 1931, no. 427, where it was presumably acquired by Schulman and offered at his auction on 14 December 1931, no. 35. One of the few 'gold giants' of the early modern period worth 100 ducats, the largest coin denomination ever minted until the advent of modern investment gold coins in the 1990s. Bernd Kluge writes in the foreword to the book *Goldgiganten* (2010, p. 13): "Die Marke des ganz großen Goldes (50 Dukaten) haben im Münzbereich nur der Kaiser, die Könige von Spanien und von Polen, die Fürsten von Siebenbürgen, die Erzbischöfe von Salzburg und die Republik Venedig erreicht oder überschritten. Die neuzeitlichen Goldgiganten im Maximalwert von 100 Dukaten entfallen in chronologischer Folge auf Spanien (1516-1526), auf König Sigismund III. von Polen 1621 [view lot 1398], auf den Habsburger Ferdinand III. 1629 und den siebenbürgischen Fürst Michael I. Apafi 1677. Zuletzt sind 100 Dukatenstücke durch die Republik Venedig (1763-1797) gemünzt worden... Über den Wert von 100 Dukaten ist erst durch die Anlagegoldmünzen in den 1990er Jahren hinausgegangen worden." Translation: Only the Emperor, the Kings of Spain and Poland, the Princes of Transylvania, the Archbishops of Salzburg and the Republic of Venice achieved or exceeded the mark of the very highest gold (50 ducats) in the field of coinage. The modern gold giants with a maximum value of 100 ducats were minted in chronological order by Spain (1516-1526), King Sigismund III of Poland in 1621 [view lot 1398], Ferdinand III of Habsburg in 1629 and Michael I Apafi, Prince of Transylvania, in 1677. The last 100 ducat coins were minted by the Republic of Venice (1763-1797)... The value of 100 ducats was only exceeded by investment gold coins in the 1990s. - Donatus Starckh, who is recorded as an engraver in Prague between 1626 and 1635, cut the dies for this magnificent medallion coin, which is known to have also been struck at weights of 40 and 50 Ducats as well as in silver at 12, 8, 5, 4 and 3 Talers. These are not, as is generally assumed, coins for the coronation of Ferdinand III on the occasion of his coronation as King of Bohemia (which had already taken place in 1627), but rather donations from the young Bohemian king and later emperor to German princes who were to be won over to the Habsburg cause in the Thirty Years' War (according to Josef Beißer in *Mitteilungen der Österreichischen Numismatischen Gesellschaft* 23, 1951, p. 31-32).

The die for the obverse of this coin was cut in the summer of 1646 by Matthias König, and the half-taler wave cut by Christoph Amende (Am Ende, Amenda) in 1635 was chosen for the reverse. Matthias König had been assigned to assist Amende in 1632, and in the same year he was appointed die cutter at the archiepiscopal mint in Salzburg, but continued to work as an iron cutter for the mints in Hall and Ensisheim. He resigned from his position in Hall in 1647, but continued to work there with his son Maximilian. In 1648, he was elevated to the nobility and received the title of von Paumbshausen (cf. Stempel-Sammlung Wien p1279-1280).

The piece belongs to the series of 'Judenmedaillen' (Jew medals), a term that has been in use since 1699 and was popularised by Johann David Köhler in his 'Historische Münzbelustigungen' (Historical Coin Amusements) from 1729-1747. However, the Dresden numismatist Wilhelm Ernst Tentzel (1659-1707) pointed out that the creator of the medal series, which depicts emperors, kings and saints, among others, was more likely to be found among Christian than Jewish medallists. The medals are modelled on seals and graphic works, and are generally thin castings and all heavily chased, with inscriptions mostly in Gothic capital letters, as in the present piece. The place of origin and the medallist are unknown, although there is some evidence to suggest a Prague goldsmith. We owe a preliminary dating of the medals to around 1600 to Ulrich Klein (Eine juristisch-numismatische Dissertation aus dem Jahre 1755 – Ein Beitrag zu den sogenannten Judenmedaillen, Beiträge zur Süddeutschen Münzgeschichte, Stuttgart 1976, pp. 210–244).

One of the few multiple ducats bearing the image of Charles VII, the last emperor from the House of Wittelsbach. Alongside Philipp Heinrich Müller, Jonas Thiebaud is arguably the most important medallist and engraver of coin-dies from Augsburg. He was born at Neuchâtel in 1695. From his youth he devoted himself to die-sinking; from 1710 to 1714 he was apprenticed to Dassier at Geneva; on his return to Neuchâtel, he was often employed by the Mint of Berne. From 1724 to 1733 he was working for the Count of Montfort, the Prince of Hohenzollern, and the Canton of Lucerne. Later he was for three years in the service of the Ducal mint of Württemberg and from there he went to St. Gall and Appenzell. In 1740 he took an appointment as Medal-engraver to the Mint at Augsburg, where he obtained the citizenship and a pension. He engraved a great many coin-dies also for Haldenstein, Mannheim, Baden-Durlach, Appenzell, Eichstätt, Ulm, Bavaria, Bückeburg Lindau, Hildesheim and Münster.

For his support of Edward III in the war between England and France in 1338, Emperor Ludwig the Bavarian received 300,000 florins, which he probably had converted into ecu d'or in Antwerp in 1338. According to contemporary chronicles, the coins were minted by King Edward III and Duke John of Brabant, both of whom had been appointed imperial vicars by Emperor Ludwig. Hendrik Mäkeler (*Reichsmünzwesen im späten Mittelalter, Teil I: 14. Jahrhundert, Stuttgart 2010, p. 277*) assumes that the coinage continued until the early 1350s, i.e. even under Louis' successor Charles IV. The chaise d'or of Louis of Bavaria are the first gold coins of a German king and emperor north of the Alps.

The Goldgulden of the Burgraves of Nuremberg were the first gold coins minted by the Hohenzollern dynasty. The place of minting is uncertain. In a privilege granted in 1372, the emperor allowed the burgraves to mint coins in Langenzenn and Neustadt an der Aisch, but Friedrich Freiherr von Schrötter (Schrötter, Franken p. 33) assumes that the coins were minted near the gold deposits of Goldkronach, in Bayreuth. This coin has never appeared at auction and is missing from Friedberg. Struck from the dies of the taler (Dav. 1982; Grüber coll. 1982). The unsigned dies for this coin were cut by the Nuremberg medallist Georg Wilhelm Vestner (cf. Schön, Franken p. 145). This is a coin of great historical interest. An analysis of its fineness (XRF) revealed a gold content of 80.5% (silver 12%, copper 4.6%). It is therefore not Ducat gold (98.6%), but rather a multiple of the Karolin, whose gold content corresponds to that of our coin (77% gold, 16.7% silver, 6.5% copper). The Karolin, worth 10 guilders, was introduced in Bavaria in 1726 and minted in the Principality of Ansbach from 1734 onwards (we are indebted to Dr Gerhard Schön, Munich, for this information). The previous owner, who engraved the XIII (Ducats) on the coin, seems to have been unaware of this, as was the previous owner of the second known example of this coin, which is in the Kunsthistorisches Museum in Vienna and also has a 14 engraved on it.

One of the few multiple ducats of Brandenburg, which was poor in precious metal deposits, minted by one of Brandenburg's weakest electors. During the Thirty Years' War, Georg Wilhelm initially attempted to remain neutral in order to protect Brandenburg from the destruction of war. However, this policy of neutrality proved illusory, as Brandenburg's territory was strategically located between the fronts. It was not until 1631 that he joined the Protestant camp under pressure from Sweden. This decision was difficult for him, partly because he was strongly influenced by Catholic advisers such as Adam von Schwarzenberg, who was loyal to the emperor. The result was a contradictory policy that is often judged in historiography as vacillating and lacking in sovereignty. The effects of the war were catastrophic for Brandenburg: looting, destruction and population losses characterised the country. Georg Wilhelm's inability to effectively protect his territory or pursue clear political lines led to a considerable loss of prestige for the Brandenburg electorate in the empire.

An important testimony to one of the decisive turning points in Prussian and German history. Prussia's victory over Austria in the Austro-Prussian War of 1866 established Prussia as the dominant power in the German-speaking world and permanently excluded Austria from German affairs. The German Confederation was dissolved and replaced by the **North German Confederation** under Prussian leadership—an important step toward German unification. For Prussia, the victory brought significant territorial gains, including Hanover, Hesse-Kassel, and Nassau, and greatly expanded its political and military influence. Otto von Bismarck had laid the foundation for a "**Lesser Germany**" without Austria, which would become reality in 1871 with the proclamation of the German Empire. The "General's Medal" was minted in a limited edition of 100 copies in silver and 150 copies in bronze. Only 14 were produced in gold, one each for the emperor (now in the Coin Cabinet of the Staatlichen Museen zu Berlin from the collection of the Hohenzollern Museum) and for the generals and politicians mentioned. Our piece must have come from the family estate of one of the 13 personalities named on the medal (clockwise): Crown Prince Friedrich Wilhelm (Emperor Friedrich III), Prime Minister Otto von Bismarck, Generals von Herwarth, Manteuffel, Steinmetz, Mutius, Schmidt, Bonin, Prince of Württemberg, Vogel von Falkenstein, Moltke, Minister of War von Roon and Prince Friedrich Karl of Prussia. In 1871, after its victory over France, Prussia also issued a general's medal, also 85 mm in size and weighing 120 ducats. Ernst August (1674-1698), Duke of Brunswick-Lüneburg and later Elector of Hanover, played a key role in laying the foundations for the rise of the House of Hanover. Although his own reign was relatively short, his most significant achievement was securing the **Electoral dignity** for his line in 1692, elevating Hanover's status within the Holy Roman Empire. This move positioned his family for greater political influence in Europe. Most importantly, he was the father of **George I of Great Britain**, and through his efforts, the House of Hanover became closely tied to the English crown—ultimately leading to the **Hanoverian succession** in Britain in 1714.

The reason for striking this medal is unknown. Steuweit assumes that it was struck in 1701, the year of the Act of Settlement, which was a crucial turning point for the British monarchy and directly shaped the future of George Ludwig of Hanover. Passed by the English Parliament, the act ensured that the English crown would pass exclusively to Protestant heirs, bypassing numerous Catholic claimants. It named Sophia of the Palatinate, a granddaughter of James I, and her Protestant descendants as rightful successors to the throne. As Sophia's eldest son, George Ludwig was positioned as the heir presumptive after the childless Queen Anne. This legal foundation paved the way for his eventual accession to the British throne as King George I in 1714, marking the beginning of the Hanoverian dynasty in Britain.

This coin, unlisted in Friedberg, is of outstanding numismatic significance. Not only is it one of the few joint coinages of the early modern period, it is also the only gold coin of the Franconian Circle known to exist, apart from the coin (weighing 8 ducats) in the Berlin Coin Cabinet from the Ansbach Collection (<https://ikmk.smb.museum/object?id=18201925>). On 28 September 1624, the representatives of the bishops of Würzburg and Bamberg and the Margraves of Brandenburg-Bayreuth and Ansbach decided at Schoss Scharfeneck near Baiersdorf in the "Bayersdorfer Abschied" to establish a joint mint for the four rulers in Fürth. Both the coins of the individual rulers and the joint coins were to be minted there. Georg Wagner was appointed as warden and Conrad Stutz as mint master. Stutz was not only one of the most talented die engravers of his time, but had also made a fortune during the Kipper period (1619-1622) by minting large quantities of low-value coins. He ran the mint in Fürth as an independent entrepreneur and received remuneration from his clients of approximately 7 to 17% of the face value of the coins he minted.

Adolph von Dalberg is considered a formative figure in the development of the abbey in the 18th century. During his tenure, he implemented important reforms in administration and ecclesiastical matters, which contributed to strengthening state and spiritual authority. Particularly noteworthy is his promotion of education and culture: he initiated the founding of the University of Fulda, which opened in 1734 and made the principality an important centre for science and theology. Under Dalberg's leadership, Fulda experienced a golden age in which art, architecture and spiritual life were promoted on a lasting basis. His work contributed significantly to establishing Fulda as a cultural and religious centre in the Holy Roman Empire.

Probably before 1560, but no earlier than 1553, when Johann van Cöllen the Elder took office as mintmaster, the city of Hamburg began minting large gold coins. These were probably intended primarily as representative pieces and only secondarily as trade coins. The Portuguese 10 cruzado coins, which had been minted since 1498, served as a model. Portugal had considerable gold reserves through its colonies, which were then distributed in coin form, mainly via Flanders. The city of Hamburg was the first German mint to produce these Portugalöser coins weighing 10 ducats, initially in small numbers, probably mainly for representative purposes, as is suggested by the occasional double Portugalöser coins weighing 20 ducats. The few known early Portugalöser coins that still have a nettle leaf in the city gate and, like their Portuguese models, have a mirror-inverted N in the inscription, were all minted with one pair of dies. They are correspondingly rare. Of the public collections, only those in St. Petersburg, Vienna, Gotha and Frankfurt (Deutsche Bundesbank) have a specimen of this incunabulum of German large gold coinage. In 1745, the Duke established a new mint in Burg Stargard, and on 26 July 1745 Christoph Henning Jaster was sworn in as mint master. However, the leaseholder and initiator of the new mint was the Chamberlain Carl Georg Friedrich of Behmen, who was appointed director of the Mecklenburg-Strelitz mint on 1 October 1745. The tenant and master of the mint wanted to share the profits from coinage. However, Behmen's early death on 17 September 1747 heralded the end of the mint in Burg Stargard. Jaster minted the last coins there on 13 July 1748. The new tenant was the Court Councilor Hartwig Heinrich Brunsich, who was commissioned with running the mint in November 1747. He oversaw the relocation of the mint to the residence in Neustrelitz, where his mint master Jaster began striking coins on 8 August 1748 (cf. Kunzel pp 228-236).

This type of coin was minted in silver between 1627 and 1630; gold strikes are extremely rare. As a free imperial city, Nuremberg was an important Protestant stronghold. Ferdinand II, a staunch Catholic and emperor, pursued a consistent policy of counter-reformation and consolidation of his imperial authority in the empire. Nuremberg attempted to preserve its independence and stay out of military conflicts as much as possible. This may explain why this coin was minted with a representative image of the emperor, as a tribute from the city to the emperor.







The piece is likely to have come from the Ferrari collection. Philipp la Renotière von Ferrari (1850–1917) was not only the owner of what is believed to be the largest and most valuable stamp collection that has ever existed, he also had an extensive coin collection. As early as 1911, the Berlin Coin Cabinet was able to acquire his collection of Carolingian coins (at that time the most important in the world with 966 pieces). His other collections, however, were confiscated as evidence of contemporary history. Ferrari was born in Paris as a French citizen and belonged to one of the richest French families. He had a particular fondness for Germany and Austria, which went so far that he took Austrian citizenship.

Ferrari kept large parts of his collections at the Hôtel Matignon in Paris. His mother had given the building to Austria-Hungary as an embassy residence. After his death, not only the Hôtel Matignon but also the collections it contained were confiscated by the French state. Ferrari himself had actually bequeathed the coin collections to his brother, two friends and the museums in Hanover (the German coins), Hamburg (the Scandinavian coins) and Belgrade (the Eastern and South-Eastern European coins) in his will, which the French state did not recognise, however. Between 1922 and 1929, large parts of the collection were auctioned in London, Paris and Amsterdam (without mentioning the previous owner Ferrari), and individual remnants were sold by Louis Ciani in Paris in the 1930s. The coin offered here is likely to be one of these remnants.

Since 6 January 1547, the troops of the Schmalkaldic League had been besieging Leipzig, but were unable to take the city. The Ernestine Prince Elector Johann Friedrich was encamped before the city, while the Albertine Duke Moritz supported Leipzig. The money needed to pay the mercenaries during the siege was raised by minting emergency coins of Leipzig in silver and gold, mainly from church utensils and silverware from the Bishopric of Merseburg. On 27 January, the troops were finally forced to withdraw. The unsuccessful siege of Leipzig marked a turning point in the Schmalkaldic War, which was finally decided three months later in the Battle of Mühlberg in favour of the imperial party supported by Duke Moritz. As a result, the Ernestines lost their electoral dignity to the Albertines under Moritz. This also marked the end of the joint coinage of the Saxon Ernestines and Albertines.

Christian II presented himself as a staunch Lutheran prince and adhered to the Lutheran orthodoxy, which made Saxony the leading power within the Protestant part of the empire. At the same time, he strove to maintain a certain neutrality towards the intensifying confessional tensions that would later lead to the Thirty Years' War. He attempted to balance Saxony's position between the Protestant imperial estates and the Catholic imperial court in Vienna, but without entering into any clear alliances. He strove for orderly financial policies and also promoted education and the arts, for example by supporting the University of Wittenberg. His early death in 1611 at the age of only 28 ended a period of relative stability.

This extraordinary coin, the only known specimen, is also recorded, as a 25 and a 30 multiple ducats (which have never appeared at auction) as well as the silver 4, 3, 2, 1 1/2 and 1 taler denominations more frequently encountered. 

Until now, only the specimen illustrated at Helmschrott, from the Riechmann & Co. auction, Halle, 11, 4 March 1918, no. 40, was known. There it was described as 'apparently unedited'.

The first university in Würzburg was founded in 1402, the fourth in Germany, but closed again by 1427 due to a lack of financial resources. The re-establishment of the university (Academia Iulia) in 1582 was closely linked to the Counter-Reformation: Bishop Julius Echter pursued the goal of strengthening the Catholic faith and counteracting the spread of Protestantism in the Bishopric of Würzburg. The university was to serve as a centre of Catholic education and, above all, to train clergy who would support this mission. On 2 January 1582, Pope Gregory XIII granted official approval for the establishment of the university. The university began as a Jesuit college and comprised the faculties of theology, philosophy, law and medicine. Theology in particular played a central role in training qualified clergy. With its foundation, the University of Würzburg contributed significantly to the cultural and scientific development of the region and established itself as an important academic centre in southern Germany.

Together with his brother and successor, Friedrich Karl, Johann Philipp Franz von Schönborn gave his name to the art-historical term 'Schönborn era', during which the prince-bishopric established itself as a centre of Baroque art and culture. After importing money previously produced in Germany became impossible due to the encirclement of German East Africa by Belgian and British troops, the governor of German East Africa, in 1916 Heinrich Schnee, established a mint in Tabora. There was no skilled personnel available. He therefore appointed the mining engineer Friedrich Schumacher as head of the mint. Schumacher set up the mint with the simplest of means in a corrugated iron shed on the railway premises in Tabora. He acquired his knowledge of minting technology from nothing more than a conservation encyclopaedia. Most of the gold used for minting came from the colony's most productive mine in Seleke. The blanks were scraped and filed by seven Sinhalese gold workers from Dar es Salaam to the prescribed weight of 7.17 g (fineness 750/000). The coins were minted using a simple hydraulic press. The coin's design was created by the cashier of the railway workshop, R. Vogt. The dies themselves were cut by the Sinhalese goldsmith Vatthiare, who worked particularly carefully when he was under the influence of alcohol. Due to the high demands placed on it, the hydraulic press soon failed and minting had to be continued in Lulanguru, 25 km away, using an oil press. A total of 16,198 coins of this type were minted between 15 April and 5 September 1916. While the reverse die held, the obverse die (J. 728a) broke, probably due to the higher pressure in the oil press, so that two new dies had to be cut (J. 728b). Our piece is one of those minted with the original dies, meaning that it may actually have been produced in Tabora. Veit Didczuneit has recently thoroughly researched the exciting history of the 'gold elephants' (Die Spur der Goldelefanten. Die 15-Rupien-Münzen aus Tabora in Deutsch-Ostafrika als kolonialherrschaftliche Wertzeichen, Brandenburg 2021).





The Battle of Narva in the Great Northern War was fought on 20 November 1700 between the troops of the Swedish king Charles XII and the Russian army under the command of Charles de Croÿ. It ended in victory for the numerically inferior Swedes, lifting the siege of Narva. 10,500 Swedish soldiers faced 35,000 Russians. Not least the onset of a snowstorm, which blew in the Russians' faces, enabled the Swedes, who had the wind at their backs, to launch their attack. The battle ended in disaster for the Russians. There were 6,000 to 10,000 dead and 20,000 prisoners, while the Swedish side suffered 1,000 dead and 1,000 prisoners. The Swedes captured all of the Russian artillery and the war chest containing 32,000 roubles. The Battle of Narva had almost halved the strength of the entire Russian army.

"The most spectacular gold coin in Polish numismatics" as Dariusz F. Jasek mentioned in the subtitle of his monograph on this gold giant. The provenance reported in *The Numismatist* magazine (cited from Jaschek p. 86) "this coin is said to have been given to the reigning Pope at the time, and two hundred years afterward it was obtained from a descent of the same Pope" cannot be further verified. If this is the case, it must have been given by the Polish king to Gregory XV (1621-1623) or, under certain circumstances, to Urban VIII (1623-1644).

Regarding the occasion for the minting of this extraordinary coin, we quote Jaschek (pp. 33-34): 'Following most well-known sources, the Polish 1621 hundred ducats coin was struck to commemorate and honour the Polish victory over the Turks at Chocim. Despite the unquestionable importance of the religious meaning behind the battle of Chocim, from a militaristic perspective it could hardly be called a victory for the Commonwealth. The battle of Chocim resulted with the signing of the peace treaty, because both sides were unwilling to continue. On the Polish garrison, gunpowder had almost run out, and the Ottoman forces were weary to new attacks. The upcoming winter was also a factor to cut off battles on both sides. By signing a peace treaty, the Commonwealth acknowledged the supremacy of the Ottoman empire over Moldova and promised to put an end to the Cossacks from invading Turkish territories. The Ottomans agreed to respect and leave the Commonwealth border at the Dniester river unchanged, and undertook to stop the Tartars from invading the Commonwealth lands. Such conditions and terms cannot be claimed as a great military victory of the Polish allied army, but rather a compromise between two forces. However, the battle of Chocim may be considered to be important to commemorate by minting such a noticeable gold coin because of its religious aspect. For the first time in this period of European history, the invincible Ottoman power and the Sultan's dreams of a further Islamic expansion into Christian countries was effectively hampered by the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth army. As a zealous Catholic, King Sigismund III Vasa could announce his religious victory by minting the 100 ducats pieces. In doing so he could glorify the power and majesty of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth, under the pretext of being the defender of Christianity against Muslims in Europe. The commemoration of the Battle of Chocim may not be the only possible reason of minting. The justification for minting this coin may also be much more prosaic. At the time decisions made by the Polish King Sigismund III Vasa were staunchly different from those made by other European rulers. For almost the entire period of his reign in the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth, King Sigismund III Vasa directed his efforts to expand the union with Lithuania to new countries, namely Sweden and Muscovy. Consecutively, he displayed considerable megalomania and obsession with his power because despite existing tensions with his realm, he was willing to wage war against other nations to get closer to the aforementioned goal. In addition to the endless wars with Sweden, in 1609-1618 there was also an armed conflict between the Commonwealth and Russia, also

known as the Moscow War or the Polish-Russian War. What's of significance is that, regardless of the initial success early in the battle, the chance to take the throne in Moscow was lost. It's also remarkable, that despite winning a number of battles, the Polish King did not win any important wars. Eventually, he did not take the throne of Sweden, for which he was constantly thriving for, nor Muscovy, and he remained the King of Poland until his death in 1632. All in all, minting the largest gold coin at the time may be found here as a need for King Sigismund to satisfy his ego, and a way to stress the importance of his rule and power to other countries. Finally, although the battle of Chocim is the only important event to achieve commemoration in 1621 in the Commonwealth, the emission of the hundred ducats pieces has earned an entirely different interpretation. This is attributed to it being used as a regular trade coin. Instead of presenting the commemorated event on one side, as could be expected (this battle is not mentioned by name on this coin!), a very regular element found in other coins - the king, the legends with his title, and the arms - were punched on both sides of the hundred ducats. However, by issuing such a large gold trade coin the prestige of the ruler was highlighted anyway. When looking for a reason to use such a large coin in transactions, we need to remember that at the time an enormous amount of money was transferred from the Commonwealth to Hungary. What's significant is that three pieces of the 100 ducats were found in the collection of the Hungarian family of Esterházy. At that time trade between Hungary and the Commonwealth was intensive, and such a large gold coin could easily be used for payments, as a regular trade coin. Also a huge flow of gold coins to Gdansk resulted with a stable supply of a large amount of raw material for minting gold coins in Poland. Next to its size, the only aspect making this coin unusual, when compared to other trade coins, are the dies used for minting, which are absolutely a masterpiece of the die-sinker'.

The mint in Wschowa (Fraustadt) was founded by Andreas Tympf, who was previously mint master in Lüneburg and later in Rostock, as a leaseholder of the crown mints. In the face of the approaching conflict with Khmelnytsky and troubles with his Swedish neighbour, the king needed a significant amount of coinage to pay his army. The mint in Wschowa, located far from the areas of potential conflict, was a very good location. During the first two years of operation, in addition to small coins, talers and ducats were also produced at the mint. They stand out from other coins of John II Casimir with their unusual royal portrait - without a crown but with a laurel wreath.

The Battle of Chocim in 1673 was part of the long-standing conflict between the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth and the Ottomans for control of the border regions. In the battle, Polish Hetman Jan Sobieski, later King Jan III Sobieski, led the Commonwealth troops to a decisive victory. The Polish-Lithuanian forces were able to repel the Ottoman troops under the command of Grand Vizier Köprülü Fazıl Ahmed Pasha and inflict heavy losses. This victory consolidated Poland's position in the region and strengthened Sobieski's reputation as an outstanding military leader. The Battle of Chocim also had political significance: shortly afterwards, Jan Sobieski was elected King of Poland. The success contributed to the stabilisation of the border areas and was an important step in the fight against Ottoman expansion in Eastern Europe. The battle is considered a symbolic event in Polish military history and is often remembered as an example of resistance against the Ottoman threat.

After the death of her brother Frederick William in 1625, with whom the Teschen line of the Silesian Piasts died out in the male line, Elisabeth Lukretia fought a long legal battle for her property rights to the Duchy of Teschen, which was to revert to the Crown of Bohemia as an extinct fief. It was not until 1638 that she obtained the consent of Emperor Ferdinand III, allowing her to retain the duchy for her personal use for the rest of her life. After Elisabeth Lukretia's death in 1653, the claims of her husband and children to succession in the Duchy of Teschen were rejected. The duchy, which had been a fief of the Bohemian crown since 1291, reverted to the Kingdom of Bohemia as an extinct fief.



The reign of Cristofor Báthory fell within a critical period in the principality's history, marked by growing tensions between the Ottoman Empire, the Habsburg Monarchy, and internal power factions. Cristofor came to power after his brother Stephen Báthory, then Prince of Transylvania, was elected King of Poland in 1575. As Stephen could not govern both realms simultaneously, he entrusted the rule of Transylvania to Cristofor as his regent and later as prince. Cristofor Báthory worked to maintain the autonomy of Transylvania while carefully managing the principality's status as an Ottoman vassal. This required diplomatic skill, especially in balancing the expectations of the Sublime Porte with the pressures from Catholic and Protestant factions within Transylvania and from the neighboring Habsburg lands. Internally, Cristofor continued his brother's policy of relative religious tolerance, which was a hallmark of Transylvanian politics in the second half of the 16th century. He supported the Unitarian and Calvinist communities, while also trying to contain the influence of radical religious movements. At the same time, he began consolidating princely authority, a necessary step toward strengthening the principality's institutions. Though not remembered for leading military campaigns, Cristofor maintained a stable reign in a time of geopolitical fragility and paved the way for continued Báthory rule.

Sigismund Rákóczi came from the lower nobility, but rose to become one of the most influential men in the principality through his military talent, strategic marriages and his position within the Reformed Church. After the death of Stephen Bocskai, who had successfully asserted himself against the Habsburgs, Sigismund Rákóczi was elected prince in 1607 with the support of Protestant noble circles. He benefited from his religious affiliation with Calvinism and his reputation as a staunch defender of Hungarian and Saxon interests against Habsburg centralisation. Rákóczi had already distinguished himself militarily in the Bocskai uprising (1604-1606), where he served as one of Bocskai's most important generals. He fought against the Habsburg troops who were attempting to bring Transylvania under greater imperial control, thus helping to secure Transylvanian autonomy. After the successful conclusion of the Peace of Vienna (1606), which guaranteed religious freedom for Hungary and Transylvania, Rákóczi emerged as Bocskai's successor. However, his reign was short-lived, as he was unable to control the political pressure from Vienna, Istanbul and his own ranks. Above all, the unstable internal situation – with rival factions of the nobility and an increasingly fragmented political climate – made it difficult to maintain his rule. He abdicated in favour of Gabriel Báthory as early as 1608. Despite his short reign, Sigismund Rákóczi is considered an important transitional figure between the leadership of Bocskai and the later consolidation of the Rákóczi dynasty, which gained new significance with his son Gheorghe Rákóczi I.

Gabriel Bethlen's legacy is controversial. Some regard him as an enlightened absolutist ruler who promoted economic development, while others consider him a cruel and greedy plunderer. His military campaigns against the Habsburgs during the Thirty Years' War were met with varying degrees of success. He promoted Protestant education and culture, founded the academy in Alba Iulia and supported the spread of Reformation ideas.

Gheorghe Rákóczi I advocated for strengthening Transylvania's autonomy within the Habsburg and Ottoman power structures, skilfully balancing between the two great powers. Under his rule, Transylvania enjoyed a period of relative stability and growing influence, even though the region remained subject to constant external threats. His political and military activities laid the foundation for Transylvania's later importance as an independent principality within the Central European powers.

The inscription on the reverse side of this coin is a quote from Paul's Epistle to the Romans 9:16 (So then it is not of him who wills, nor of him who runs, but of God who shows mercy).

Mihai Apafi I ruled as Prince of Transylvania from 1661 to 1690 during a turbulent period marked by shifting alliances between the Ottoman Empire and the Habsburg Monarchy. Apafi managed to maintain Transylvania's relative autonomy by skilfully balancing these two powers, accepting Ottoman suzerainty while cultivating cautious relations with the Habsburgs. Around 1668, the fortress of Făgăraș played a strategic role in regional defence and politics. As a key stronghold in southern Transylvania, Făgăraș was important for controlling the area and protecting the principality's southern borders from incursions. Under Apafi's rule, the fortress continued to serve as a vital military and administrative centre, reflecting the ongoing efforts to maintain stability in Transylvania despite external pressures. Apafi's reign is remembered for relative internal peace and for safeguarding the rights and privileges of Transylvania's diverse population until his death, after which the principality increasingly came under Habsburg influence.

In 1605, Sibiu was at the centre of the conflict between the Habsburgs and Stephen Bocskai. While large sections of the Transylvanian nobility joined the uprising against imperial rule, Sibiu remained steadfastly loyal to the crown. One of the most vocal advocates of this stance was the leader of the Transylvanian Saxons and city judge of Sibiu, Albert Huet. He knew how to rally the citizens behind the Habsburg cause and encourage them to resist at a time of extreme threat. When Bocskai's troops appeared before Sibiu in 1605 and laid siege to the city, Huet's influence was particularly evident. With his help, the city prepared for defence and withstood the attacks of the Hajdú hordes, who wanted to eliminate Sibiu as a Habsburg stronghold. The siege brought hunger, hardship and fear within the city walls, but the inhabitants held out and refused to surrender. Huet's role as an unwavering supporter of the Habsburgs gave the Saxon community a clear political profile: loyalty to the crown and preservation of their own rights under imperial protection. Their successful resistance during the siege made Sibiu a symbol of imperial stability in Transylvania – and Huet himself a leading figure of this attitude.

The talers from Sibiu minted in 1605 are commonly referred to as emergency talers in numismatic literature. However, they are more likely to be commemorative coins minted to mark the successful resistance against Bocskai's troops, as evidenced by the fact that a few gold coins weighing 10 ducats have also been preserved.


